

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ales of Prochem Europe's acclaimed Microsan® sanitiser and cleaner have increased by nearly 14 per cent over the past two years. 2007 saw a 31 per cent increase in Microsan units sold against the previous year.

Sales of the solution, the result of a £5m investment in research and development in the US, have increased by a staggering 760 per cent since launch.

"Sales have increased noticeably since 2004 due to public awareness of its effectiveness in the fight against infections such as MRSA," says Prochem Europe MD Alan Tilley. Unlike some chemicals producers, Prochem has not marketed Microsan as a reaction to the malaise presently facing Britain's hospitals, hard hit by infections such as MRSA.

"Microsan came about in 1999 and was originally developed as a disinfectant product for carpets," says Alan.

"There was a major problem within the healthcare sector at the time concerning blood spillage on carpeting due to the blood-borne viruses such as Hepatitis and HIV. The only prescribed method was to clean with sodium hypochlorite, which effectively bleached the carpets and low profile floor coverings used in many hospital areas," he says.

With a recognised niche brand within the carpet cleaning sector, Prochem looked for an approved raw material and formulation to effectively disinfect the carpet but without damaging the colour of the carpet.

"The formulation used proved also to be effective against MRSA but this wasn't a consideration in its initial development," Alan says. "Microsan came about in 1999 and was originally developed as a disinfectant product for carpets"

Recognition grew with Microsan winning the coveted Cleaning Show Innovation Award in 2005. The EC- and USA-registered antimicrobial multisurface sanitiser and cleaner is effective against bacteria (including MRSA), viruses (including Hepatitis B and HIV), fungi, algae and mildew. It is also approved to EN1276.

In October 2007, the Government announced that a new regulator, the Care Quality Commission, would be set up with the power to fine hospitals over infections. It also promised to introduce greater powers for matrons to order extra cleaning on their wards, and pledged that every hospital would undergo a "deep clean" within a year.

The Government's pledge that every hospital would undergo a "deep clean" within a year was questioned by the Cleaning and Support Services Association, which argued for more regular cleaning of hospitals.

Patient Concern's Joyce Robins said: "Deep cleaning just seems like a gimmick. Patients would much rather have really good day-to-day cleaning."

A FAST-TRACK WAY TO SUPERIOR CLEANING

FIRST SCOTRAIL IS THE LATEST UK **RAILWAY FRANCHISEE** to specify Prochem Europe truck mount cleaning technology for train floor and upholstery cleaning.

The company has installed a static Prochem Apex diesel-powered extraction cleaning machine in a purpose-built shed between buffers of two lines in sidings at one of its Glasgow depots.

"We used another truck mount provider previously but had to have it shipped miles away for maintenance and repair," says Laura Mathieson in the



Procurement Team. "The decision was taken to look for a company that could provide a top-quality machine but ensure it could be maintained locally."

Carpet cleaning teams work at the Glasgow depot from Monday to Thursday and can clean two full trains a night with the Apex. Head of train care Jim Burns is delighted with the new purchase. "It's fantastic. We are still using the old machine but it only managed one train a night so this is far superior," he says.

The arrival of the Apex is an example of First ScotRail's continued investment in the franchise and the company's commitment to raising quality and standards. Train refurbishment has led to improved reliability and a better overall journey experience.

ordered, South West Trains is well on track to scoring major improvements in carriage seat upholstery appearance, performance and durability.

At Stagecoach subsidiary South West Trains, which runs around 1,700 trains every weekday to 213 stations and employs around 5,000 staff, cleaning is more than a fad.

Its investment in cleaning is now a matter of record. Internal audits are carried out after a 'P' Exam (floor to ceiling) cleaning schedule and the scores are regularly above 95 per cent, with some carriages peaking at 100 per cent.

London Waterloo is at the hub of a network which enables approximately 180 million passenger journeys a year on routes through Greater London, Hampshire (including the Isle of Wight), Surrey, Dorset, Wiltshire, Berkshire, Devon, Somerset, Cornwall and Middlesex.

Cleanliness is paramount in the rail travel experience. "Our customers will not tolerate sitting on filthy seats on filthy trains and frankly why should they?" says

Mike Hoffman, depot manager for Waterloo and Clapham Traincare depots.

"Our job is to provide them with the optimum standards of safety, comfort and hygiene while they are travelling with us."

Mike is responsible for train presentation cleaning duties in the Waterloo and Clapham area.

He has overseen the static installation of a third Prochem Apex diesel truck mounted cleaning extractor at the company's depot at Clapham Junction. His depots form part of a London production team that use another Apex, housed in sound-proofed sheds in

Wimbledon, while a further machine is installed further down-line in Portsmouth.

The machines are located in their own secure buildings at the end of the platforms enabling hoses to be run out the length of a four-car train. While the machines are used for cleaning carpet where installed, the principal 'enemy' is upholstery.

"User research revealed cleaning as a number one priority as carriages are where most customers spend their time on a journey," says Mike.

Chewing gum is a regular offender, as is graffiti and drinks staining. "You can imagine what

the seats look like after twenty four hours," he adds.

The solution in using an Apex against portables is power. "You can get more done faster in essence," says Mike. "These are very powerful machines."

Six in-house operatives at Clapham have been trained at Prochem to make the most of the Apex. The London-end employs 130 cleaners and every carriage's upholstery and carpet are deep cleaned from between 0900 and 1700 every 30 weeks as part of the 'P' Exam.

This complements two further regimes: standard cleans overnight and turnaround cleans at each terminus for trains between return trips to and from London. South West Trains employs over 265 cleaners to carry out this exacting work.

"Cleaning may not be the most glamorous of jobs but I believe that our train presentation staff are among the most important people on the railway these days," says Mike.

"They've got the most physically demanding jobs going and are a credit to what they achieve."

KIT FOR PURPOSE

ave you spotted troublesome stains but haven't got the solution on the van? Get kitted out, advises Peter Hargreaves.

Having the capability to deal with spots

Having the capability to deal with spots and stains is essential to the professional cleaner. So is having the correct solutions on the van.

I can think of more than one occasion over years of taking technical calls where I have given callers enquiring about stain and spillage issues the correct method of removal and the appropriate product to use. I then get asked the question: "what else can I use, I don't have this on the van?"

Often, there is no alternative to the recommended product. The cleaner is unable to clean the stain or spill and therefore complete the job to the customer's satisfaction.

If you don't have the skills in the first place, you can book yourself onto a Prochem training course and brush up on your stain removal techniques by staining small pieces of carpet. You can get these from your friendly local carpet shop as off cuts or sample swatches.

Practising this way expands your experience and knowledge (and confidence) in tackling the many different stains encountered by the professional cleaner day to day.

That's the skills part dealt with. What about the solutions?

You could buy all the containers of all the stain removal products in the range, store them in the van and then play hunt the product on the day, with the worried customer standing

The range consists of nine new eco-considerate products, which have been formulated and designed with an emphasis on superior environmental attributes, while still maintaining the highest possible standards of quality and cleaning performance.

Why have you introduced this range?

In line with our Environmental Policy, we aim to ensure all our products are as safe for the environment as possible. As awareness of environmental issues has increased, this has in turn led to a growth in demand for 'greener' products and services.

Increasingly businesses and organisations are becoming more environmentally conscious and interested in lowering their impact on the environment. Many now include environmental questionnaires as part of their purchasing and tendering processes.

Domestic customers are also now more environmentally aware, some requesting that their properties are cleaned using only the safest and most ethical products. Prochem's new 'Natural' range has been introduced to offer a choice of innovative solutions to environmentally conscious users, who wish to use the 'greenest' cleaning products available.

What is the concept behind it?

The intention with the range is simply to raise the bar in terms of providing environmentally-friendly cleaning products.

Its development meant re-looking in depth at our products and exploring new ideas and technologies.

As we see it, the 'Natural' range embodies notions of:

- ➤ **SAFETY** The 'Natural' range uses low toxicity ingredients considered safe for both the user and the environment.

Some top tips for helping make the workplace more environmentally friendly. Make a start by getting your own workplace more environmentally sustainable - and save money.

- Turn all computer equipment, machinery or other mechanical appliances off when not in use. You've wasted enough on average to run a small car for 100 miles.
- > Print or photocopy on both sides of paper, recycle envelopes and labels and turn scrap paper into notepads.
- Switch off unnecessary lighting, particularly near windows or in corridors. Use energy-saving lightbulbs: they use up to 75 per cent less energy than traditional bulbs and last up to 12 times longer. The Energy Savings Trust calculates that changing just one bulb will reduce your lighting costs by £9 a year.
- > Position desks and workstations to make best use of natural light.
- > Ask the last person to leave work to ensure that they turn everything off including printers, drinks machines, fans, computers and lights. Pin a checklist by the alarm panel or exit.
- > Get the building properly insulated.
- Turn down the heating. Make sure radiators and heaters aren't obstructed. Turning your heating down by one degree will save 10 per cent on heating bills - now there's money saved!

Spots and stains make everyday demands on the professional cleaner. In this issue, we look at some of these as well as a handy standby solution from the Prochem range in its Professional Spotting Kit ('PSK').

Q I understand that Prochem has discontinued Gluespot (A281). Do you have another product that will do the same job and if so, what is it called?




A277 Solvex is the product that will work on hardened varnish, paint, etc. and

can be used on carpets and upholstery. Make sure you wear the black neoprene gloves provided in the 'PSK' to protect your skin from the solvent.



What are the best products to use to remove tar from carpets?



minutes before rinse extracting out with warm water.

What is the best method to use for removal of coffee and tea stains?

Apply B144 Stain Pro and blot, then rinse extract with a solution of B109 Fibre & Fabric Rinse.

Further improvement may be made by applying **B195** Coffee Stain Remover, and blotting. This can be repeated and left for 15 to 30 minutes before rinsing with water. If necessary, apply E400 Red Rx evenly to stain and place a clean damp folded white Terry towel over



stain and press a hot iron over area for two or three seconds. As a 'last resort' for difficult stains on white, off white or plain pastel colours (not patterned), a foam solution of 30ml B151 Oxibrite*, 60ml B162 Fibrebuff and 30ml B105 Fibre Shampoo, can be applied and left to dry on the area. Some coffee and tea stains may be permanent.

* NB B151 Oxibrite, oxidising additive for white, off white and pastel coloured fibres and fabrics (not patterned) is now sold in new size 1 kilo packs.

Old dried-in blood stains can be especially difficult to remove. What is the correct procedure

to follow?

Firstly, remember to take safety precautions and avoid infection or contamination. Apply B144 Stain Pro, agitate and allow to dwell for up to two minutes and then rinse extract with a solution of If residue of stain remains, apply B198 Rust Remover. Allow two to five minutes

dwell time and rinse thoroughly with water and blot until dry. It may be necessary to apply a solution of 30ml of B151 Oxibrite* per litre of water (subject to testing and colour restrictions as before).



What product do you recommend for the removal of candle wax?

As well as the action which gave the product its name, **G240 Chewing** Gum Remover can be applied in

this instance, once you have scraped off as much wax as possible with a spatula or blunt knife. After application, break up and remove the

pieces of wax. Then apply E840 Citrus Gel or B123 Solvall Spotter and blot.

To remove chewing gum, use the above method, but after application of G240 pierce gum with the chewing gum perforator included in the 'PSK'.



How can I clean and eradicate the smell of cat urine on carpets?



If still wet, blot up as much as possible. Apply B153 Urine Neutraliser and blot.

For old stains, apply B109 Fibre & Fabric Rinse as a HOT solution and extract. Repeat two to three times. Apply Urine Neutraliser and leave to dry. Urine stains may cause permanent dye removal and may damage wool or nylon.



A customer has asked me to clean a rug which has been stored in her garage for a long time and it has mould and mildew on it. What is the best product to remove these?

You will need a combination of products to get round this problem - and I had better inform you that some of the dark spots from the mould may well be permanent. Spray the rug with **B125 Clensan** and allow 15 minutes dwell time (this will kill the mildew and mould and will deodorise the rug). Then rinse extract with a solution of **B109** Fibre & Fabric Rinse. Then proceed to clean the rug with a solution

of B107 Prespray Gold as a prespray and rinse extract with a solution of B109 Fibre & Fabric Rinse.



A DRIER SOLUTION

ot water extraction cleaning forms an important part of the Prochem Europe technology offer. But let's not forget the role of dry cleaning systems, too. These play an equally valid role in cleaning best practice, notably in maintenance cleaning methods.
